The reaction of the scornful American public when Vietnam soldiers returned, caused shame and anger in Veterans. Known as "secondary wounding", these feelings sometimes surface at end of life.  2. Interventions for healing will be reviewed:  - Grieving unmourned losses  - Forgiving unforgiven guilts  - Releasing shame  - Contrasting "moral injury" and "soul injury"  3. The Anchoring Heart Technique can be used by the Veteran and/or the Veteran's family to "ground" themselves during times of anxiety-producing memories.
